As for the matter of getting more members to work, we know that some have good reasons for being unable to participate but there are more than a few who could but don't. Why don't they? I suspect some of the reluctance may be due to feeling that they don't know how to run a walk or take care of sign-in duties. But don't hesitate because of this; there is always someone who will be happy

to train you. All of us who do work on walks had to start on their first one, too. A good place to start is helping out the POC on a Wednesday walk. And if you'd like to be the

POCS WANTED – Barbara Kolapakka

Yes, yes, I know! We haven't even held our first traditional event in 2009 and she's already looking for POCs for 2010! But there's a good reason: we try to get our schedule for the coming year in place by June of the current year and we have a lot of holes to fill in the traditional events schedule.

We do have one event on the schedule: our Octoberfest will be in Menands thanks to the efforts of Marion and Dave Averill. But we need:

March for Parks event (should be in April if possible)
Spring picnic (May or June)
Two or three other events (May, June or Sept.)

Would you like to run a walk but don't have any idea where? Here are some suggestions:

<u>March for Parks:</u> Any park or a historic site run by a park service will qualify. Traditionally March for Parks events are held in April which may be problematic since some otherwise good sites may still have muddy or even snowy trails then but we have always managed to find someplace to hold this event. Here are some parks that I pulled off the State Parks and Recreation website; they may or may not be suitable sites, haven't checked them out personally.

Clermont State Historic site (We did a walk here many years ago and a map of that walk is available.)

Olana State Historic site Glimmerglass State Park Minekill State Park Lake Taghkanic State Park Thompson's Lake State Park

<u>Spring picnic:</u> A park that might be too wet to hold the March for Parks event could still make a great picnic site; most have pavilions. But any place that has a pavilion and seating for a large

group would be fine as a start point.

Other events: Parks can be used for any event but here's where you have more chances to be creative. You just need a good start point with sufficient parking nearby and restrooms and then plan a route through a town or neighborhood or natural area. Or you can re-visit some of the walks we did in the past. Maps of these are available and you just need to re-check the route and start point availability. Some suggestions for re-doing a "golden oldie": Lenox, MA, Bolton Landing, Cambridge.

You don't have to have the route absolutely nailed down by June but you should be reasonably certain that the walk is doable and that you have a usable start point identified.

AROUND THE NORTHEAST REGION - Phil Hait, Northeast Regional Director

The time is fast approaching for any potential candidates for Region Director (RD) to declare. If you are interested in this job, contact Phil Hait as soon as possible. RD responsibilities are as follows:

Coordinates and carries forward the AVA program of activities in his/her region.

Maintains a close, active liaison with member clubs and state organizations within his/her region and between the NEC and AVA Headquarters.

Reviews application for membership from new clubs in his/her region and recommends action to the NEC on chartering.

Representing the AVA, approves scheduling and sanctioning of volkssport events for member clubs within his/her region and provides notice of sanction approval to the member club and the AVA Headquarters. Where possible, allows state presidents to approve event sanctioning within his/her state and any affiliated state, subject to final approval by the Region Director. This is strictly at the discretion of the Region Director.

Reviews monthly delinquent reports and provides follow-up to ensure all reports have been submitted and all obligations due the AVA have been paid.

Promotes the development of new clubs within his/her region by visiting, corresponding with and making presentations to interested groups to promote the growth of the AVA.

Advises member clubs within the region of AVA or IVV rules.

Develops and introduces agenda items, participates in discussions of all agenda items at the NEC and Executive Committee meetings.

As a voting member of the NEC, has a responsibility to ensure that votes on all matters before the

body represent the best interest of the Association. Even though he/she is elected by a specific region, he/she must consider the overall interests of the Association.

May chair an AVA committee appointed by the President and approved by the NEC.

Performs membership-recruiting program within the region.

Promotes a publicity campaign within the region to promote volkssporting and the AVA.

Identifies, contacts and encourages qualified individuals to seek office at the national level.

Identifies and recognizes outstanding individuals within the region through the AVA Recognition Awards Program and with Certificates of Appreciation.

Develops and maintains information on each member club within the region and is aware of the different types of member clubs, their structure, sponsorship and membership.

Perform such other duties as may be prescribed by the President or NEC.

Is assigned a table at the National Convention Banquet for inviting guests to this event.




