HAVE A **SAFE** WALK

The weather's warm, the sun is shining (usually) and you want to get out there and walk and chat with your friends. That's all great, but don't get so involved in your socializing that you forget that you are sharing space with others like bicyclists and cars. Remember to always walk safely on any roadway shared with cars by keeping to the shoulder of the road if at all possible and walking facing traffic. If there are sidewalks, use them! And don't walk side by side in groups too large to be confined to the sidewalk or the side of the road; drivers don't expect you to be in the road.

Remember that you share bike paths with bicyclists; most cyclists will call "on your left" when passing and you should immediately get to the right to let them through.

On both roads and bike paths, don't scatter on both sides of the road or path when you hear something coming; move over to the correct side of the road or path.

Guided walk leaders should make sure that they have the group cross roads at a safe spot, preferably at a designated crossing if one is available. And be patient at traffic lights and wait for the "walk" signal. Leaders should hold up if the whole group can't get across at one time. A little time lost is better than a life lost.

VOLKS SOUTH COMPLETES 8TH SEASON – Doug

ESCV's winter satellite, located on the Florida Suncoast in the greater Tampa Bay area, completed a very successful eighth consecutive season. Back in 2004, not having access to a Wednesday walking program, six of our northern club's members who are snowbirds (Marion/David Averills, Gail/Paul Van Valkenburg, and Jackie/Doug Reynolds) decided to meet every Wednesday morning to do one of the local club's YRE. As other short and long term snowbirds, as well as some fulltime Floridians heard about the gatherings, they asked to also be included, and they suggested that a season long schedule be developed and placed on the web. The group grew from the original six to a weekly average for this season of 25 walkers, plus 24 staying for group lunches. The total for the 14 walk schedule was 360 walkers with 340 going to lunch for continued fellowship.

Eileen Skinner will keep the 2011 schedule posted on our ESCV web page until late fall when it will be replaced with the 2012 schedule (www.ava.org/clubs/escv, and click on the map of FL). This will provide you with an idea of the range of communities that we visited for either a 5 or 10 K walk.
