LAKE PLACID WALK - Vera Weiss and Barbara Kolapakka

Don't forget to save Saturday, September 15th for the Lake Placid walk. Marion Burns has once again offered to bus people to and from Lake Placid. September should be a beautiful time to visit this wonderful community and to enjoy all that it has to offer. The 5K and 10K walks are the same walks that were offered in July 2007.

The 10K walkers will be walking on the Peninsula Nature Trails for less than 2 miles. These trails do have a lot of roots so one needs to walk slowly and carefully here. Hiking shoes and a good walking stick might be in order. These trails comprise some of the oldest recognized rock formations on earth. The metamorphic rocks which are visible today were carved to their present configuration by glacial activity, which occurred over a span of a million years. The last glaciers disappeared 12,000 years ago leaving the rugged Adirondack Mountains and many beautiful lakes such as Lake Placid.

These trails are situated on a parcel of 133 acres of land purchased by NYS in 1960. The area was logged over during the 1940s, except for a 200 foot wide strip of undisturbed forest along the lake shore. If you walk quietly, look and listen, you may see or hear birds or wild animals living on the Brewster Peninsula. Resident mammals include snowshoe hares,

squirrels, chipmunks, mink, muskrat, moles and shrews. Whatever—just enjoy your trip on these trails, be careful and do try to sit on one of the several benches along the Lake Placid shore to enjoy the views!

You will also be walking by the Lake Placid Marina so you might want to take a one-hour narrated 16 mile sightseeing boat ride on beautiful Lake Placid. Go to www.lakeplacidmarina.com for more information!

There are lots of wonderful shops and restaurants in Lake Placid so please come and enjoy this wonderful scenic spot in our own back yard.

Barbara and I will be heading up there on Friday, September 14th. We plan to stay at the Comfort Inn, go on a Lake Placid boat ride and then set up signs for our 10K walkers on the Peninsula Trails.

We look forward to seeing each and everyone of you on September 15th. PLEASE remember to give a donation to the Adirondack Community Church for once again allowing us to use their church as our start/end point. We so appreciate their generosity!

CHANGES COMING TO YRE/SEASONALS IN 2013 – Barbara Kolapakka

Next year will see some changes coming to our year round and seasonal events. We will add a new seasonal, Clifton Park, to the list. Eileen Skinner and Father Jack Cairns have developed a route and secured a start point at the Hilton Garden Inn. Father Jack will be the point of contact. The walk will run from April 1-November 30.

Eileen has asked to step down as POC for the Caroga Lake walk. If we wish to continue this walk we will need to have someone step up to take over the POC responsibilities before the end of August. If you are interested in this assignment, please contact Barbara Kolapakka at bkola67@gmail.com or 583-9038.

Our thanks to Eileen who helped develop this walk, originally as a traditional, and has been the POC for thirteen years.

We will be eliminating the Albany Neighborhoods walk after this year. It has not had the participation we had hoped for between group walks. This route may be used for a Wednesday walk sometime in the future.

In addition to Father Jack, we have another new POC joining us this year. Dave Janiga will be taking over the Albany Capital walk from Teresa Kennedy. Teresa in turn will be the POC

for Schenectady replacing Ellen McNett who has asked to step down. Ellen will still host her wonderful soup party after the Schenectady winter group walk. Our thanks to Ellen for being the POC for Schenectady for many years.

We are also converting two of our seasonals to year round events by transforming them into snowshoe events for the winter months. Snowshoers will be able to get event and distance credit at both the Saratoga Battlefield and the Saratoga State Park. Neither of these sites is suitable for a walk when there is snow or ice but both are popular snowshoe venues.

AVA has no minimum required distance for snowshoe events so you don't have to worry about doing 10k or even 5k on snowshoes. Linda Morzillo has developed a snowshoe route for the Battlefield and we will use an existing route around the golf course designed by park staff at the Spa park. The sign-in point for the Spa park snowshoe will remain at the Hilton Garden Inn and snowshoers will drive to the park to start. (Note: the snowshoe events will NOT be available until January 1 even if there is snow this December.)

The start point for the Saratoga City walk will return to Virgil's Coffee House, hopefully this fall. Virgil's is in the process of moving to a new location on Henry Street and has told us they will welcome us back when they are situated in the new space. In the meantime we will continue to use the Hilton Garden Inn as the temporary sign-in point.

Another start point change will be effective next year for the Crossings walk in Colonie. We will move the start box to the Cicotti Center from Fleet Feet. The Cicotti Center is the large building we walk by on the current route. While Fleet Feet has been a welcoming host, its hours were not always convenient for walks starting in the morning. The Ciccotti Center opens at 5am on weekdays and 7am on holidays so you can get a really early start!
