GROUP WALKS AND GROUP RESPONSIBILITY

We schedule 30 group walks of our YRE/seasonals each year. That means 30 chances to get together with others to do these routes. We look forward to seeing our friends at these low key gatherings but they're also a great chance to meet new people. We have been seeing a significant number of new walkers at them so far this year. However, the large number of attendees has actually led to some problems:

While these aren't guided walks and don't have a designated leader (POCs are NOT required to be there), it has been the practice that someone takes responsibility for putting out the registration sheets and collecting the walk fees and then returning the walk box to its designated location. That person also should forward the fees to the POC since money should never be left in the box. Unfortunately, when some people have volunteered to do this service, they have found that, while they are returning the box, the rest of the walkers have taken off and left them behind, sometimes so far behind that they end up walking alone.

New walkers are understandably befuddled by some of our procedures and may need some guidance from an "old hand" on how to sign in, etc. and how a group walk works. Again, this information comes from someone volunteering to guide them. If no one does this, it may well discourage them from ever walking with us again. And it is very important that new walkers not be left behind.

We need cooperation from all of our walkers to make these group walks go smoothly. POCs do a lot of work behind the scenes to keep these walks going. The group walks are scheduled up to a year in advance and conflicts may arise which prevent them from being at their walks, so we need to have others step up and oversee the registration process at the group walks and help out new walkers. It's not a heavy lift to collect the money and send a check to the POC or to return the box to wherever it is stored. A big "thank you" to the people who do this. And, please, as a courtesy, make sure they're not left behind while the rest of you go off on the walk. The whole group doesn't have to wait but there should always be some folks who will linger a little longer to make sure everyone has someone to walk with. And make a special effort to include anyone new to volkswalking in your group. Remember that "friendship" is just as important as fitness and fun in our motto.

"FREQUENT WALKER PORPOSAL" - An Incentive Program for ESCV Members – Eileen Skinner

Many years ago, ESCV instituted a Frequent Walker Program. The purpose was to offer, at a discounted price, the opportunity for walkers to do the same walk multiple times during the year. This was to encourage walkers to get out and walk more and save money. At the February ESCV monthly meeting, this program was voted to be deleted due to apparent lack of use and a misunderstanding of its purpose. AVA, our national organization, has changed the rules, now allowing members to walk the same Year Round or Seasonal walk as many times each year as they wish and receive both Event and Distance credit stamps.

Attached to this newsletter is a new proposal to reinstate the Frequent Walker Program (click here) with modifications from the previous program. This proposal is provided to you so you can read it in advance and be prepared to **Vote on it at the April ESCV monthly meeting**.

Basically, the first three times you do the same walk, you will continue to pay the \$3.00 fee as in the past. After the third time you do the **same walk**, all subsequent walks (same walk) will have a fee of \$1.50 (which was previously \$1.00). You may walk this same walk as many times as you wish during the rest of the calendar year and get credit for it while saving some money. The new fee of \$1.50 covers the AVA and ESCV administrative expenses."

NORTHEAST REGIONAL DIRECTOR – Doug Reynolds ESCV SATELLITE GROUP "Volks South"

In the 9th season in the Greater Tampa Bay area, we are having our most successful winter walking season as measured by attendance, both for walks and those staying on for group lunches. Last season, we had a total of 360 walkers; just passing the midpoint of the 16 walk series this season, we have already had a total of 304 walkers (average 38/week), and 265 lunchers (33/wk). In addition, the Volks South group hosted for the Suncoast Sandpipers, their monthly special event for February, by designing and conducting the North Anna Maria Island Walk. After the passing of a cold front, but still under threatening skies and high winds, there were 74 walkers who participated. If we included this count into those who attend the Wednesdsay walks, the participation jumps to 378 for our gatherings, so far.

We are most pleased on the large number of first-time walkers who have joined us from various parts of the US, and of those, the large number who have returned to continue the weekly experiences, and have bought New Walker Packets. Even though many are not from our Capital District, we encourage them to hook up with a club near their northern homes to continue the walking fellowship through the spring, summer, and fall seasons.
