IF YOU'RE GOING ON THE DINNER CRUISE PLEASE READ

DIRECTIONS TO THE LAKE GEORGE STEAMBOAT COMPANY DOCK

<u>From the north (Bolton Landing)</u>: Take the Northway to exit 22. At the end of the ramp turn left, go over the overpass and take the right hand exit to the stop sign. Turn right onto Canada St., go through four traffic lights and turn left onto Beach Rd. You may also take a slightly slower, but more picturesque, route south on Route 9N which will become Canada St. in Lake George Village.

<u>From the south:</u> Take the Northway to exit 21. Turn right at the stop sign. At the traffic light at the bottom of the hill turn left onto Canada St. Go to the second traffic light and turn right onto Beach Rd.

After entering Beach Road: Go past the strip of stores to the cruise line parking lot entrance immediately to the right of the large building with the tower on the right. Tell the attendant you are with the walking club (they may not recognize ESCV) and you will get a discounted rate of \$5 to park. The boat dock will be directly across the street from the parking lot.

There are port-a-johns behind the large building. Indoor facilities are available at the Visitors Center located at the intersection of Beach Rd. and Canada St. If you wish to change clothes, the VC is the best place to do that although, remember, walking attire is the dress for the day. Wear your 25th anniversary shirts!

TICKET DISTRIBUTION

Your tickets will be available at the dock of the Lake George Steamboat Company between 4:30 and 5:30 that day. They will NOT be available before 4:30.

- -Do not go to the ticket window; we will have a table set up near the docking area of the Lac Du St. Sacrement. There will be two lines divided alphabetically (A-L and M-Z) by last name. If you have two or more reservations with the same last name or in the same half of the alphabet one person can pick up all the tickets. This will help keep the length of the line down. (We have 180 people coming!).
- -Once you have your ticket, keep it in a safe place. If you lose it before boarding you will have to go to the ticket office and purchase another.

BOARDING PROCEDURES

- -We can start boarding at 5:30. Our tables are on the second deck. An elevator is available for anyone who has difficulty climbing stairs. Ask a crew member to take you to the elevator.
- -Our tables are reserved and are a combination of four, six and eight places. All tables will have a window view. There are restrooms on our deck and also a bar if you wish to purchase an alcoholic beverage. Wait staff will also bring drinks to your table.
- -The cruise leaves at 6:30 so you MUST be on board by then. There are no refunds if you miss the boat.
- -The dinner will be served buffet style. Wait staff will call tables by number.
- -The cruise will last 2 hours and 15 minutes. There will be live entertainment on the first deck.

We have a large group attending with a number of new members included. Please wear your name tags to help you meet new friends and remember old ones! If you don't have a name tag, we'll have name stickers for you at the registration area.

A NEW RAIL TRAIL

Has been proposed by the Mohawk Hudson Land Conservancy (MHLC) and supported by the Friends of the Rail Trail (FORT) for a 2.6 mile section from Voorheesville Avenue to Upper Font Grove Road. This safe path will be for exercising, biking, walking, inline skating, birding, etc.

MHLC/FORT wrote to ESCV to keep us informed as they move forward to bring this project to fruition. They would welcome moral and emotional support from our walking group in their community-wide effort to bring the Rail Trail into Voorheesville. The letter went on to say that "Our community shares your grief at the loss of your friends, and is hopeful the opening of the Rail Trail in our town will help assuage that grief as we work together for a shared cause".
