Spring weather is here and our walks are in full swing. The first two Traditional Walks of 2014 took place in Kinderhook and Schenectady's Central Park. POC Bernie Geren reported that 57 walkers enjoyed the walk in Kinderhook even though the apple blossoms were at least a week into the future. It was cool and breezy in Central Park where 53 walkers enjoyed the new route though woods, on park paths and in neighborhoods laid out by Teresa Kennedy. The names of the first two winners of \$25 gift certificates to L.L. Bean were drawn! Congratulations to Warren and Dorothy!

Our spring picnic will take place on June 14th after a Traditional Walk in Catskill, a revitalized town. We will be walking over the Rip Van Winkle Bridge where the natural beauty will remind us of Thomas Cole and the Hudson River School of Painting as well as the works of Washington Irving and James Fenimore Cooper. POCs Rita Gavin and Mary Sorell have reserved the pavilion at Dutchman's Landing. Be sure to look at the lovely brochure on our club website prepared by Teresa Kennedy. Along with times and directions, there is background information that explains why this walk is scenic, cultural and historic. Another winner of a \$25 L.L. Bean Gift Card will be announced that day.

The Wednesday walks got off to a damp start. There were 21 walkers for the Saratoga Museum Walk the morning of April 30^{th} and zero walkers in the rainy evening (21/0). Dan Schryver had 50/8 walk in Voorheesville on May 7_{th} in perfect weather. The tulips in Washington Park on May 14^{th} were absolutely stunning when Dave Janiga led 47/3 walkers around Albany. The new route designed by Vera Weiss and Marylou Geren around Malta's Tec-Smart Park area was enjoyed by 65/7 walkers.

Group walks for our YRE/Seasonal lineup are continuing. Cooperstown's 22 walkers enjoyed clearing skies and warm temperatures on May 10th. POC Winnie Balz noted that "every spring flower seemed to be blooming." On May 24th, Nellie Georgelos led 30 people with raincoats and umbrellas in a walk around Johnstown. Volkssporters may be as sweet as sugar but do not melt in the rain!

There are seats still available on the bus to Plattsburgh for the walk on September 13th. We now have specific times: Departure time from Exit 8 Park and Ride is 7:30 am and pickup at Exit 15 next to Dick's at Wilton Mall is between 8:00 and 8:15am. We will arrive in Plattsburg around 10:00am after a rest stop between Exits 35 and 36. We will leave Plattsburg at 4:30 pm and arrive at Exit 15 about 6:30 pm and Exit 8 around 7:00 pm. There are many differing opinions (some quite vocal), on the start time for our group walks; there are people who would like to see these walks start at 9 AM, at 9:30 AM, or remain at 10 AM. These are the <u>informal group</u> walks of our YRE/Seasonals we often schedule on a Wednesday from September through April or a Saturday when there are no one-day walks scheduled. (This means that the May-August Wednesday Walks and the Traditional One-Day Events will still begin at 9 AM.) The Sunday time of 1:30 to walk a group walk will remain in place. In order to decide the time in a *democratic* fashion at which we will start our group walks in 2015, every member has **one** vote. Please send me an email with your time of preference by June 30th. I will keep a tally for each of those 3 times and I will keep a list of names separate so that I can be sure each person votes only once. If you have a strong preference for one of those times, be sure your voice is heard. - *Linda*

Year Round Events (YREs) and Seasonal Events are usually do-it-yourself walks. YREs are available to all walkers almost every day of the year and walks called Seasonals are available during the warmer months. People often do these walks on their own at their own convenience. We schedule a Informal Group Walk, once in the spring and again in the fall, for each of these walks. We start out together, there is no leader, each person or small group walks at their own pace. Traditional Events are walks usually held only once, on a certain date, most often on a Saturday morning. People arrive at the start point during a period of time (usually between 9 AM and noon), sign in, get a start card, obtain a map and walk at their own pace. Wednesday Walks are those guided walks we do on Wednesdays from May through August. We start at 9 AM and 6 PM with an added time of 6:45 AM during July and August. People choose the time they wish to walk. These are a modified form of a Traditional Event. Please note the following correct information for the June 4, 2014 Cohoes/Waterford Wednesday walk. Please cut out and paste into your Wednesday walk booklet.

<u>Course:</u> Some steps are along this walk. May not be suitable for strollers, etc.

<u>Directions:</u> From Northway take Exit 7 to Alternate Rte. 7 east to 787 north. Take 787 north to the end. Continue straight over railroad tracks, continuing on North Mohawk St. through 2 traffic lights. As you approach yellow blinking light (at Manor Ave. and No. Mohawk St.) near Cohoes Falls, you will see a parking area just before LePage's Market on the left. There is limited parking here. You may also park in the Falls View Parking lot just below LePage's and walk the short distance up to the Start Point. Other option: Turn left just past the Market onto Manor Ave. and park on the right in the paved area on Reservoir St./Erie St. and walk back around the corner to the Start Point which will be in the LePage's Parking Lot.

From Clifton Park area: Take Rt. 9 south to Cohoes-Crescent Road (left just over the bridge). Continue to Manor Avenue (blinking light). Continue straight for 2 parking options or turn at Manor Avenue for other. See above.

From Latham: Take Rt. 9 north to Boght Rd./Manor Ave. (Cumberland Farms). Turn right and go to end which is the corner of Manor Ave. and No. Mohawk St. where LePage's is. See above for parking.
