

#### **Element3 Health**

There has been a lot of talk about the Element3 Health Program and partnership with AVA. In a nutshell if you have health insurance that qualifies you can take advantage of this program and get free walk vouchers at no cost to you. At this time United Healthcare Medicare advantage and supplemental plans are the only ones that qualify; however, other health programs will be added as additional contracts are negotiated

Here's how you can quickly and easily check to see if you're eligible

All you will need is your health plan ID card to determine if you are eligible. Or call Element3Health (833) 906-1700

## Or send email to info@element3.com

If you're eligible, every time you participate in a club activity (up to 10 times per month), your health plan will pay Element3 for your participation! For every 5 club activities you report per month, you will receive one walk voucher (max of 2/per month).

Below is the process that eligible program members will follow to receive their free walk youchers:

Each qualifying participant will receive an email from AVA informing them how many

vouchers they will receive, when they will be available, and whether they qualified for a one year complimentary AVA Membership.

All qualifying participants must have a "myava.org" account in order to receive your vouchers.

For each voucher awarded, AVA will place a \$3 credit into you Online Startbox (OSB) account. These vouchers can be used for any OSB Event.

As members redeem their vouchers on the Online Startbox (OSB) the club will be report this participation on their quarterly report and will receive a credit for \$1.75 for the redeemed voucher.

The February Checkpoint will have additional information on this program so stay tuned.

The Empire State Capital Volkssporters (ESCV)

hosted the AVA biannual convention in June, 2019. During the preparation and planning for the convention, ESCV discovered that there was an increased interest in bicycle riding options in addition to the traditional walking opportunities.

With that in mind and some research with other clubs regarding proper biking protocol, ESCV developed two bike rides for the convention - one in Schenectady featuring the historic Stockade area and biking along the Erie Canal and Mohawk River. The other ride was through the Saratoga National Historic Park (locally known as "The Battlefield"), along the Hudson River and through the Gerald B.H. Solomon Saratoga National Cemetery. Unfortunately, the weather was not good for bike riding. ESCV decided to continue the bike rides the following year and offer each one as a group ride. That turned out to be very popular with good attendance.

The decision was made to add three more bike rides to the list which include:


- Zim Smith trail
- Albany-Helderberg trail
- Pattersonville trail.

Highlights on the Zim Smith trail include biking a mostly shaded trail featuring Round Lake, an old Methodist Camp, and a nearby must-stop bakery. The trail continues through a "bird cage" and passes a railroad yard before ending at Mechanicville.

The Albany-Helderberg trail takes riders along the Hudson River in downtown Albany and then up a gradual incline to the Helderberg hills. Riders cross the Normanskill and pass Delmar and Slingerlands before arriving at Voorheesville to finish at a lovely pavilion and RR park.

The Pattersonville trail features the Amsterdam walking bridge across the Mohawk River, with its flowers and trees growing in season, a lock on the Erie Canal, and remnants of the aqueduct across the Schoharie Creek.

For 2022, ESCV further expanded the biking opportunities. Although members can do these rides anytime during the season, most people enjoy the social advantages of the company with others. Thus, during the 2022 season, there will be two group rides scheduled for each of the five sanctioned rides. Since all the rides were developed by one POC, coordinating ten rides during the summer and early fall seemed like a bit much. To remedy that issue, ESCV came up with a new concept of having each ride "hosted" by another member of the club to take the burden off the POC. The "host" will be responsible for the coordination of the ride that day, scheduling, safety instructions, assistance, etc. The POC will continue to have responsibility for ride development and any changes.

ESCV is very excited about this new opportunity to provide more riding opportunities. Many of the rides have been scheduled for weekends so that working people and students will be able to participate. Of course, ESCV guarantees perfect weather - clear skies, light breeze, low humidity and temperatures in the low 70s! Just perfect!

As we head out of the icebox and into spring, we're looking ahead to a positive year in Northeast Volkssporting!



**New Online Start Box Events:** Two clubs have joined the wonderful world of OSB. The Two Town Volkssporting Club has refreshed the Rockport walk into an OSB event with some beautiful new directions and maps. It's even accessible via commuter rail from Boston. And the Southern Maine Volkssporting Association has transformed the Augusta capital walk into a hybrid Online Start Box / Physical Start Box walk — the best of both worlds. SMVA has created a new Saco OSB walk and has plans for another new walk soon.

AVA now has over 900 events accessible via the OSB, which accounts for 50% of our walks and growing by the minute. Two Northeast clubs have most, in not all, of their Year-Round and Seasonal walks on OSB.

**Northeast Weekend 2022:** The Niagara Frontier Volkssporting Club is busy planning this year's event scheduled for Friday September 16 to Sunday September 18. I appreciate the clubs holding those dates open so we can fully support NFVC over that weekend. We hope each club is represented and can make plans for 2023.

**IVV Olympiad 2023:** Since my last report, I have attended AVA Board of Directors Zoom meetings on November 11, January 12, and February 9. A wide array of discussions were held but mostly concerned the Olympiad. A final BOD okay was voted upon on February 9 so plans are full steam ahead.

AVA Policy & Procedure Committee: Each Board member is assigned national committee duties and I have been given the task of chairing this one. We have identified eleven stand-alone policy and procedure documents spread among various pages in the AVA legacy website ava.org. The manuals and guidelines are in various stages of being updated so if you have any questions or suggestions regarding any AVA document, this is a good time to send them to me.

AVA IT Committee: Upcoming enhancements to the new website my.ava. org were announced in the most recent TAW. At the February 9 meeting, Chris Zegelin and Mike Green outlined new sanctioning procedures that will shortly be in place. I have extensively used the new website over the past few years and it's a great improvement over the legacy site. At some point in late February AVA will announce a shut-down of the websites for a few days so major changes and updates can be made to the system. If any immediate website work needs to be done, please do so as soon as possible.


























# New ESCV member shares her thoughts on *Fun Fitness and Friendship*


I am a new member of ESCV, since October 2021. I first attended ESCV walks last summer when I was invited by a good friend who had joined the group after hearing about it from another friend.
